

Emergency Dental Instructions for Parents & Caregivers

Dental emergencies can be frightening, especially when they happen to children. Quick, calm action can help save a tooth or prevent further injury. Below are detailed instructions for common dental emergencies, along with tips to help prevent them in the future.

KNOCKED-OUT PERMANENT TOOTH (AVULSION) - ACT FAST!

What to Do Immediately:

- 1. Stay Calm & Locate the Tooth
 - Quickly find the tooth and pick it up by the crown (the top part that's usually visible in the mouth).
 - Avoid touching the root. The root contains delicate cells that are vital for reattachment.
- 2. Gently Rinse (If Dirty)
 - o If there is visible dirt, rinse the tooth gently with cool water for no more than a few seconds.
 - o **Do NOT scrub, brush, or disinfect** the tooth. Avoid soaps and chemicals.
- 3. Try to Reinsert the Tooth
 - o If your child is conscious and cooperative, gently place the tooth back into its socket.
 - Have the child bite down on a clean gauze or cloth to keep it in place.
 - Do not force it if it doesn't go in easily.
- 4. If Replanting Isn't Possible
 - Keep the tooth moist at all times!
 - o Place it in one of the following:

- A cup of cold milk (best option)
- Saline solution
- Clean water (only if no other option is available)
- Never let the tooth dry out.

5. Get to a Dentist IMMEDIATELY

- o Time is crucial ideally within 30 minutes.
- o Bring the tooth with you and inform the dental office of the emergency on your way.

BROKEN OR CHIPPED TOOTH

Steps to Take:

1. Clean the Area

Rinse your child's mouth gently with warm water to clear blood or debris.

2. Control Swelling

• Apply a **cold compress** or ice pack to the cheek or lip near the injury to reduce swelling and pain.

3. Find and Save Any Tooth Fragments

- o If a piece of tooth is found, place it in **milk or saline** and bring it to the dentist.
- o In some cases, the fragment can be reattached.

4. Seek Dental Care Right Away

- Even small chips can lead to infection or sensitivity.
- o A dentist will check for nerve exposure or hidden fractures.

PREVENTING DENTAL EMERGENCIES

✓ Use Protective Gear

 Make sure your child wears a custom-fitted sports mouthguard during physical activities such as soccer, basketball, skating, or martial arts.

✔ Practice Car Safety

- Always use properly installed car seats or booster seats for young children.
- Ensure everyone wears seatbelts, even on short trips.

✓ Make Home Safe

- Childproof areas where falls or accidents may occur especially around hard surfaces and furniture.
- Many oral injuries happen to toddlers under 3 while learning to walk or climb.

✓ Schedule Regular Dental Visits

- Routine checkups help catch weak or decayed teeth before they break.
- Preventive treatments such as sealants and fluoride strengthen enamel and help avoid emergencies.

IMPORTANT REMINDERS FOR PARENTS

- **Do not panic.** Children look to you for reassurance.
- Never place a knocked-out baby tooth back in the mouth. Baby teeth are not reimplanted.
- Keep an emergency dental kit at home or in your car with gauze, a small container, saline or milk, and the
 dentist's emergency contact.
